PART II. COMPARABLE LEVEL OF EDUCATION

ICES Recommendation

Credential 1:

- The first year of study toward the University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, Bachelor of Science - Horticulture is considered generally comparable to the completion of Grade 12 (High School Completion) at a recognized secondary school in British Columbia and elsewhere in Canada.
- The first three years of study toward the University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, Bachelor Science - Horticulture are considered generally comparable to the completion of the first two years of undergraduate study at a recognized post-secondary institution in British Columbia and elsewhere in Canada.

Basis of ICES Recommendation

The factors considered in the evaluation of this credential include: the educational level at which the credential was awarded; the normal basis of admission to the program of study; the total years of study required to complete the credential; and the recognition of the institution.

Credential 1:

- The first year of study toward the University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, Bachelor Science - Horticulture normally requires the completion of a total of 12 years of study: 11 years at the primary and secondary level, and 1 year at the undergraduate level.
- The completion of Grade 12 in British Columbia normally requires the completion of a total of 12 years of study at the primary and secondary level.
- The first three years of study toward the University of Agriculture, Abeokuta, Bachelor Science - Horticulture normally requires the completion of a total of 14 years of study: 11 years at the primary and secondary level, and 3 years at the undergraduate level.
- The first two years of undergraduate study in British Columbia normally requires the completion of a total of 14 years of study: a minimum of 12 years at the primary and secondary level, and a minimum of 2 years at the undergraduate level.
